ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Undergraduate juniors who are studying economics, finance, statistics, or related subjects have the opportunity to become a Summer Analyst Intern at Analysis Group. Analysis Group also seeks MBA and Ph.D. students a year away from graduation for their summer associate position.

Summer interns join one or more case teams, gaining real analyst/associate experience within an inclusive and collaborative environment. Intern responsibilities include “conducting market and company research, summarizing data for case-specific needs, performing independent and directed data analysis, participating in meetings with academic experts and team members, developing computer programs using software like SAS,” and more. Internships at Analysis Group also offer super fun social events and help students establish a real community with both fellow interns and Analysis Group professionals. Summer analyst candidates should begin the application process in the fall semester before the summer they wish to intern. The summer associate process kicks off in December and runs through March.

The internship program at Analysis Group is perfect for students who have a keen interest in utilizing quantitative methods and solutions in solving issues that require creative and nuanced solutions. Applicants should have strong communication skills, a passion for problem-solving, and a desire to pursue a career that inspires a lifetime of learning and growing.

This is, unfortunately, just the nature of economic consulting in general. The majority of the time, though, the work is interesting, and it is a pleasant place to work with lots of great benefits.”

- “Analysis Group is very respectful of interns’ time. The firm expects a lot from interns, and in return, they are treated with respect. Interns are expected to be in the office 4 out of 5 days, but hours are very flexible.”

Culture of Acceptance

- “[The] office is very diverse, with people from all sorts of backgrounds and different family structures. [The] company is explicit about making it a good environment for all. I was always respected and encouraged to share my thoughts and where I was coming from.”
- “Character is praised as much as intelligence at Analysis Group—being a team player and contributing to a culture of kindness is noticed and appreciated. My team members want to get to know me as a person, not just as an analyst intern, allowing me the opportunity to feel at home at this company.”
- “AG employs a diverse range of people, and everyone who works here is very nice and welcoming. It’s been a very accepting and inclusive environment.”

Career Development

- “One of the best aspects of the internship is that, from the start, you are getting involved in real case work. The work you do matters and actively contributes to the firm’s success. The assignments are challenging, but there is also a very fast learning curve, and the mentor program allows you to ask questions and reach out to important resources.”
- “They provided ample training on the statistical software needed [to] work efficiently here. Each intern is assigned a peer mentor and an advisor, both of whom provide guidance as you navigate the internship. Multiple social and networking events were organized to enable networking with senior staff and foster interaction between interns.”
- “The company offers meaningful training in hard skills, such as Excel, R, Stata, and more, which has been incredible throughout the summer. All interns are assigned to real case teams and are given work at the analyst level. I have never once felt like I was somebody the company had to accommodate, but rather, I have consistently felt like a true member of the team. My work is valued, and I don’t feel underappreciated at all.”

Inclusion

- “I can only speak on my lived experience. They have invested in opportunities to spot and grow BIPOC talent in economics with partnerships with, for instance, the American Economic Association Summer Program.”
- “Inclusion at AG has made me feel more motivated to come to work and engage more with the diverse group of peers that are here at the firm. Everyone brings such a unique background and viewpoint to the workspace, which makes it extremely exciting to come to work and collaborate with these individuals.”

Likes

- “The internship offered a highly collaborative environment, exposure to real client work, and hands-on experience with data analysis and economic reasoning. Mentorship was strong, feedback was frequent and constructive, and there were numerous learning opportunities through training, presentations, and case team work.”
- “The nature of the internship is based on solving problems and approaching real-world questions with a background in data. The internship energized me in how I had to work with data to find answers.”

Interview Process

- “Two rounds of interviews consisting of five interviews total. The interviewers were all very willing to answer any questions and discuss their experiences with me.”
- “Round one was a 30-minute interview with two people. Round two was a super day with four interviews: an AG/consulting interview, a behavioral interview, an economics quantitative interview, and a partner interview. After receiving the offer, I was put in contact with a former intern who was now an analyst to talk about his experience.”

Compensation

- “The pay is probably the best you can find across the industry, and compared to other industries that offer similar rates, I do not think you could really find a better mix of hours worked vs. internship salary. There are also numerous small benefits like free food and events every week or almost every week.”
- “Very well-compensated and excellent amenities in the office.”
- “Pay is competitive with other consulting jobs, and [the] work culture is much better. Some benefits include a phone subsidy and breakfast and lunch provided some days of the week.”

Full-Time Prospects

- “There are positions available for sure, but you have to make a good effort towards receiving an offer.”
- “... You aren’t competing against anyone; you are only competing against yourself. If you do a good job, you should get hired back.”

Responsibilities

- “As an associate intern, my day-to-day responsibilities include contributing to strategy meetings, conducting company research, performing financial analyses, and drafting background memos and expert reports.”
- “Cleaning data, drafting presentation slides, performing audits, conducting literature searches/literature reviews, sitting in on client meetings, [and] networking with senior staff.”
- “My main tasks consist of performing analyses on health data to evaluate the effectiveness of various drugs using advanced statistical methods. I code in SAS and present results in Excel. We aim to publish these findings at healthcare conferences.”
